NEWS FROM THE HANOVER HOSPITAL



November is National Lung Cancer Awareness Month

Lung cancer has become the leading cause of cancer death for both men and women in the US, causing more cancer-related deaths than colon, breast

and prostate cancers combined. Symptoms of lung cancer can be subtle and dismissed as the common cold or allergies. Some of these symptoms include: a cough that doesn't go away and gets worse over time, constant chest pain, hoarseness, shortness of breath or wheezing, frequent lung infections and coughing up blood. Symptoms may be vague such as weight loss, headaches, or loss of appetite. Current recommendations for lung cancer screening have improved detection, timely treatment and ultimately survival. Annual screening is recommended for those between the ages of 50-80 years of age who have a 20-pack year smoking history (meaning you have smoked 1 pack per day for 20 years or 2 packs per day for 10 years, for example) and currently smoke or have quit smoking within the past 15 years. Screening is done by performing a quick, low-dose CT scan of one's lungs. It is typically covered well by insurance.
